As I write this, Israel is under attack from missiles, from internal violence, and from verbal castigation (sometimes warranted and sometimes unwarranted). The market is up and down. The numbers of those hospitalized from Covid-19 continues to decline, allowing us to open up more and more while still striving to keep our community safe. I continue to worry for our unvaccinated children and their families, yearning to protect their health while also recognizing that kids need to be kids and need other kids around them.

As a congregation, we seek today to pursue justice for the oppressed; to support the healing of the sick; to comfort the mourners; and to perform acts of loving-kindness for those in need. As a synagogue family, we seek to address and to respond, to discuss and to reflect the ideas and issues of our day. We are timely.

By gathering for meaningful and relevant Torah study, we frame the issues of our day within the millennia-long experience, wisdom, guidance, and laws of our People, our tradition, and our sacred scripture.

By participating in synagogue life – by participating in Congregation Shaarey Zedek life – we elevate the timely into the timeless. We become part of the transcendent.

Thank you for your membership in the Congregation Shaarey Zedek family. Thank you for participating in the life of our community. Thank you for stepping up in ways small and large to lead us, to support us, to sustain us, and to strengthen us.

The summer is upon us and there is so much for which we must be grateful. As we cautiously but forthrightly re-emerge from our homes and our isolation – as our minds wrap around the notion that our world is safer now than it was a year ago – I pray that we should together pursue both the timely and the timeless. May our Heavenly Parent bless us with health and with joy, with now-ness and with transcendence, and with the desire and courage to walk always with love for our People in service to the Holy One.



**AV:** This month our theme is "comfort," and we will talk about what that means in a society where self care and boundaries are often neglected.



From our friends at Project Zug! The past year has brought with it tremendous loss and uncertainty. On a personal and communal level, many of us find ourselves grieving very tangible losses: the loss of life above all, the loss of financial security, and the loss of the intimacy of in-person relationships. At the same time, we find ourselves mourning abstract but very real losses: the loss of the world we once knew, the loss of a sense of security, the loss of normalcy. Throughout the ages, the Jewish people have experienced significant downfalls and periods of great adversity from the flood that nearly destroyed the world to the destruction of the Temple to the Holocaust, an unprecedented time of darkness and despair. And, yet each time, the Jewish people drew on wellsprings of resilience to not only continue on but to continue forward, rebuilding for the next generation.

In this three-session course, we'll look to our own tradition, focusing on narratives from the Torah as well as the events of Jewish history to mine our texts for wisdom on resilience. We'll ask: what are the different shapes resilience takes and how might we cultivate our own capacity for resilience based on the wisdom of Jewish tradition? Join us on Zoom.



## **MOVIE WATCH PARTY: FLORY'S FLAME**



Flory's Flame is a one-hour documentary weaving the life story of 90-year old Sephardic U.S. National Heritage Fellow musician Flory Jagoda into her 2013 Celebration Concert at the U.S. Library of Congress. The combined personal and musical overviews open a window on pre-Inquisition Spanish Jewish life. Flory's roots go back to that pre-1492 era, through the Balkans, settling in Bosnia and Croatia. As the sole surviving Altarac family member, with most of her family killed during World War II, Flory's life mission was to continue her family's cultural legacy through their music. Sadly, Flory passed away just this past January, but her strength of spirit shines through her challenging but ultimately triumphant story expressed in the context of the impactful music performed by Flory and 25 fellow musicians in the prestigious and inspiring Library of Congress Celebration Concert.



