
It has been a year.


It will be a New Year. May it be a blessed one for us all. We look forward to coming together, to journeying together, to building together, and, please God to celebrating ... together.

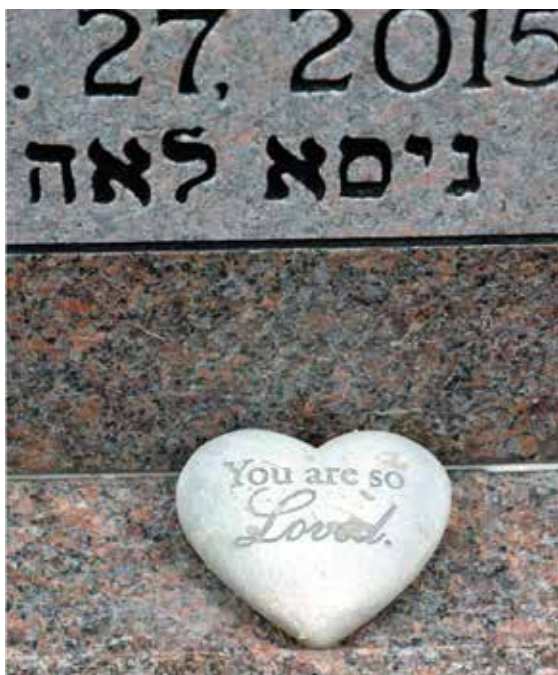

 - Rosh Hashanah Morning (Days 1 and 2)
 - Kol Nidre
 - Yom Kippur Morning
 - Yom Kippur Afternoon and N'ilah

- The PrayGround (Young Family) services require a free ticket to attend. You can request such tickets by calling (248) 357-5544.
- Minchah/Maariv and other services do not require a ticket to attend (either in-person or online). Links to attend online can be found at www.shaareyzedek.org.

MEMBERSHIP AND TICKETING

- Shul Shopping? Whether you know Hebrew or not, keep Kosher or not, are new to Detroit or are looking for a haimish (warm, inviting) place to pray, Congregation Shaarey Zedek has a place just for you. Check out our services and events, and contact Elise at (248) 357-5544 if you'd like to become a part of the CSZ family.

- Children under 16 do not need tickets. We send tickets to all members in good standing, along with their children ages 16 – 29.
- Young adults, including children of members, are invited to join Congregation Shaarey Zedek in order to attend services. There are no dues charges under the age of 30.
- The Shaarey Zedek National Membership provides full membership to those who do not have a residence within 50 miles of Southfield, Michigan. For \$360 per year, any eligible person or family who wants to be connected to our services and amazing programming can join our congregation and reap all of the benefits that membership provides. Our hope is that this membership category will attract out-of-town friends and family of current members, as well as people who have been joining our services during the past year who want to make their connection to Shaarey Zedek official. RITUAL

- Please be sure to have – for each member of the family – the High Holy Days prayerbook Mahzor Lev Shalem. Order copies at \$36 each by calling the synagogue office at (248) 357-5544, use the form at the end of this booklet, or order on our website.
- It is customary on Yom Kippur to avoid wearing leather shoes. Consider purchasing canvas shoes.
- At the PrayGround, there is a custom to wear white on Yom Kippur.
- On Kol Nidre evening and for all morning services, please remember to wear your tallit (prayer shawl).
- On Yom Kippur, please consider devoting the whole day to prayer and learning.
- On Yom Kippur, while it is considered a mitzvah (commandment) to fast, it is a mitzvah NOT to fast if fasting threatens your health or inhibits your ability to take life-preserving medication.

- Avoid using your television, computer, or phone for non-religious purposes on the holidays. Seek to be spiritually present, wherever you are and create a sacred space
